Notts and Derby Bus Company are running a new service which takes people from Heatherton and

Government is forcing change

The Government has told English Councils they must all be Unitary Authorities. They want them to have about 500,000 people in each.

Derby is already a Unitary Authority, but quite a lot smaller. Labour think it should change too.

The Conservative-led County Council at once said it should become a unitary authority, scrapping all the Districts and Boroughs. It did this without consulting other Councils or councillors. All the other Councils - Districts, Boroughs and Derby City - are now working together to discuss what would be the best for the whole of Derbyshire. Derbyshire County Council has been invited to join their discussions.

Lib Dem councillor **Ajit Atwal** said "It is 50 years since there was major change. If we have to have it, we need to make it work well. But the Government's timescales are really tight."

Lib Dems are saying that local residents and voters should have a say on the changes.

Council Budget

Council tax bills are about to go out for 2025/26. These include the payment for the Police and Fire Services as well as the City Council. The City Council part of the bill has gone up by 3.99%.

Lib Dem Group Leader, Cllr **Ajit Atwal** said "Labour wanted to increase bills by the maximum allowed. This would put £1m more straight into its bank account for a rainy day. We agree that having savings is important. However taxpayers having a bit more to spend is also important."

Lib Dem Deputy Group Leader, Cllr **Lucy Care**, said in the meeting that the budget showed hard work from officers, but lacked flair and creativity from Labour. She suggested several projects to improve Derby and its finances. These included another river turbine near Spondon.



Burton Road lights



Cllr **Ajit Atwal** on the diversion route for people wanting to cross the ring road. It can mean a half mile walk! The work to improve the junction at **Burton Road** and the ring road is causing major queues. Even worse than for drivers is the diversion provided for people walking.

The walking route sends people back along each road before providing a place to cross. For **Warwick Avenue** this means walking down and up the steep hill, even when there is no work happening.

Cllr **Ajit Atwal** said "It's not

just about time, it's that some people are not able to walk down and up again. We have asked the Labour's traffic engineers to come up with a better solution, but been rebuffed. Please sign our petition to put pressure on them to try harder."



Drain emptying

Road drains (or 'gullies') need regular emptying as they fill up with grit, which blocks them. The Council has only one gully-emptying lorry, so most drains are not being emptied often enough.

Last year, opposition councillors got a Budget amendment agreed to get a second gully lorry. More than 6 months later drains were still not being emptied when requested. Cllr **Lucy Care** asked formally if a new gully lorry had been bought. The answer was 'No.'



Also...

Bins on Pavements

The Council is to fine people who leave their wheelie bins on the pavement. So far it is being tried on just a few streets, but it is likely to be rolled out citywide. Please get into the habit of putting your bin(s) away promptly after they have been emptied. If you are going to be away, work with neighbours to make sure bins get in and out properly.

Safe Haven

Please remember, St Peter's is one of a growing number of schools in Derby which have a 'Safe Haven' outside them. Only people with permits are allowed to drive along **Thornhill Road** and **Church Street** at school start and finish times.

Bramblebrook Care Home

The Council has said that it plans to demolish the old care home on **Rough Heanor Road**. The site would then be cleared. It is likely that a planning application will follow for flats for older people. Cllr **Lucy Care** has encouraged the Council to talk with local people to help design a scheme to work well in the area.

South Derbys Local Plan

South Derbyshire have just published the version of their Local Plan that will go to the Plan inspector.


